ADVISORY

The advisory program is an essential element of the Upper School experience. Groups of 10-15 students share a teacher who serves as an advisor for four years. In addition to being the first point of contact for students and their families, the advisor plays an important role helping students hone social/emotional and executive functioning skills. Students also lead the direction of parent-teacher conferences in partnership with their advisor, an experience that helps them reflect on their strengths, goals, and opportunities for growth.

STUDENT-CENTERED EDUCATION

In our student-centered education, students drive the learning process. Starting in freshman year, students begin the college counseling process and take part in the freshman retreat and freshman-oriented seminars which highlight social/emotional learning and foundational skills needed for high school. Throughout their high school years, students have set tutorials times each day so they can obtain timely learning support. Juniors and seniors can attend talks with alumni who are currently in college, develop independent study classes, or identify service and job shadowing opportunities to develop the skills of independence and resilience for life outside the home and after graduation.

EPISCOPAL IDENTITY

Educating a child's spirit is as important to us as challenging the mind, and we strongly value our Episcopal identity. Students study one trimester of religion each year. We are privileged to gather together as a community in chapel twice a week.

IMMERSIONS AND EXPLORATIONS

In these week-long intensives, students go beyond the confines of the classroom and into the Houston community to explore everything from the business of sports to building an art car. As students progress through high school, they can focus their attention toward areas of interest, including academic study, health and wellness, and service learning.
