

Greer Conference on Mathematics, Science, and Technology at Phillips Exeter Academy in New Hampshire, where she will explore the role of technology in today's

and tomorrow's math curriculum, the use of the newest graphing calculators, and the application of Texas Instruments' new wireless networks in the classroom.



Senior Chaplain Bob Wismer's teaching is already inspired, but his upcoming trip to the Holy Land promises to make his lessons even more heavenly.
