Cozy Up: Pajamarama Is January 26

On Friday, January 26, St. Francis will celebrate our annual Barker's Pajamarama Day ingathering. On this day, **children in Primary, Lower, and Middle School are invited to wear appropriate pajamas to school to celebrate the weeklong ingathering of pajamas, books, and other items.** (If students choose not to wear pajamas, they may wear their regular uniform or house T-shirt and jeans.)

Named after Dianne Barker, head of Primary School from 1992–2008, Pajamarama continues the tradition she introduced of wearing pajamas to school one day a year in conjunction with collecting books for donation.

All donations will benefit <u>Arms Wide Adoption Services</u> (previously Spaulding for Children), an organization that supports foster children awaiting permanent homes. As in the past, the focus of the ingathering for Primary and Lower School is pajamas and books. However, Arms Wide has asked for a variety of other items that will allow them to serve the children in their care more comprehensively. For this reason, the Middle School ingathering will focus on other items, as listed below under "What should you donate?"

As usual, Pajamarama Day promises to be a lot of fun, and your support in helping our children become *people for others* is truly appreciated.

A few guidelines to remember:

What should you donate?

- Primary School and Lower School—One pair of new pajamas and one new book in the zipper-lock bag sent home with your child
- Middle School—The following items, in travel or regular size
 - Grade 5—Brushes and combs, deodorant, shampoo and conditioner, shower gel
 - Grade 6—Socks, underwear
 - Grade 7—Wipes, toothbrushes, toothpaste
 - Grade 8—Pull-ups, diapers

- LS—Pajama boxes in the People Place
- MS—House boxes in the People Place

Primary School will be collecting and donating new pajamas and books to Arms Wide Adoption Services, an organization that provides pajamas and books to foster children waiting for a permanent home in order to help create a warm and nurturing bedtime ritual.

The pajama ingathering is named after Dianne Barker, head of Primary School from 1992–2008, who started the Primary School tradition of wearing pajamas to school one day a year in conjunction with collecting books for donation.

In addition, the Parents Association has arranged for *Arts Alive!* to do a special music and movement activity with the children.

- T/Th Pre-Primary students will celebrate Pajamarama Day on Thursday, January 25.
- All children may wear pajamas to school on their designated day.
- To participate in the ingathering, please place one pair of new pajamas and one new book in the zipper-lock bag that will be sent home with your child.
- Each bag will have a label attached. Please indicate on the label the age and gender of the child who should receive the pajamas and book. (Please try to coordinate the book and pajamas: For example, pajamas for a four-year-old girl should accompany a book that would likely appeal to a four-year-old girl.)
- Zipper-lock bags containing the pajamas and book may be brought to school between January 22–26.

From the Division Head

I hope you had a wonderful weekend!

This week I wanted to share a bit about our math progression in Lower School. We are making excellent progress in the curriculum!

Our Primary II students are using the Bridges curriculum alongside
Lower School; this provides a strong foundation on which to build. Our
kindergarten and first-grade classes are using the on-level curriculum as
a start, and our teachers are accelerating the students as they
determine the need.

- Differentiation in the classroom and flexible grouping are instructional strategies that aid in achieving this purposeful goal. We continue to be diligent in creating an organic scope and sequence for instruction that is tailored to our students at each grade level.
- By second, third, and fourth grades—once each student's foundation in math has solidified—teachers begin combining grade-level concepts that accelerate the students as determined by skill/concept acquisition. By combining concepts and skills from the students' current grade level with those covered in the next grade level, we ensure that we meet our students' academic and developmental needs and help them continue progressing.

I will continue to keep you updated on the classroom work and effort that goes into nurturing strong, engaged students. In the meantime, please reach out to your child's teacher; our math specialist, Holly Plost; or me if you have questions about our math curriculum progression.

Also, please mark your calendars for our Parent Meeting on Friday, January 26, at 8:15 a.m. A guest from The Parish School will be speaking about developing social competence and resilience in our children. I look forward to seeing everyone soon!
