Expect Detour Along North Piney Point Road (Main Campus)

The City of Piney Point Village announced that **the repaving of North Piney Point Road from Memorial Drive to Greenbay Street will begin on Monday, April 23**. Traffic will be **one-way, southbound only** on North Piney Point Road from Greenbay Street to Memorial Drive during the first phase of construction.

We recommend allotting extra time for morning and afternoon carpool during this process. While these changes **will not prevent you from entering the north and south entrances** to our Main Campus, **drivers will need to turn right upon exit** and head southbound toward Memorial Drive.

Remember: Tuition Payments Are Due May 1

Annual tuition payments for the 2018-19 school year are due on or before **Tuesday, May 1**. Please bring/send your check to Chanda Hutton in Accounts Receivable, or log into My BackPack and make an online payment by credit card or e-check (for non-ACH annual tuition payers only). Note: A convenience fee is added to online tuition payments.

If you chose the Annual by ACH tuition payment plan option on your 2018–19 enrollment contract, the school will draft your bank account on Tuesday, May 1.

If you chose the Monthly by ACH tuition payment plan option on your 2018–19 enrollment contract, the school will draft your bank account on Tuesday, May 1, for the first monthly tuition payment for the 2018–19 school year. Moving forward, the monthly ACH tuition drafts will occur on the first business day of each month from June 2018 through January 2019.

A Note About the Withdrawal Deadline

Wednesday, April 18, was the deadline for withdrawing from and cancelling the enrollment contract for the 2018–19 school year without penalty (except forfeiture of the nonrefundable enrollment deposit).

Saturday, June 30, is the last day to withdraw or cancel the 2018–19 enrollment contract and be liable only for the nonrefundable enrollment deposit plus a cancellation fee.

- The cancellation fee is the equivalent of what would be paid for the months of May, June, and July under the Monthly by ACH tuition payment option. Please refer to your enrollment contract for the exact amount of the cancellation fee.
- **To be obligated for only the nonrefundable enrollment deposit and cancellation fee for the 2018–19 school year, electronically complete, sign, and submit the online “Nonenrollment/Withdrawal Form” by 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 30. That form is located in the Resources section of the Parent Portal on the school’s website.**
- For enrollment withdrawals after June 30, the parent(s) will be obligated to pay the entire enrollment contract amount for the full 2018–19 academic year.
