Check-in With the Chair: An Update From the Board of Trustees

The school year has been action-packed, from a full calendar of events to *challenging what's possible* each day. Your Board of Trustees is also active behind the scenes, ensuring financial oversight of the school's resources as well as implementing long-term initiatives, including the results of the Strategic Planning Committee.

It has been thrilling to witness the inaugural class of the Upper School in action, from their sold-out opening night of *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* to seeing "Wolfie" in the Art Car Parade.

On the fundraising front, while still in the quiet phase, *Forward in Faith: Phase II* has raised significant funds that are critical as we continue to build the Upper School and complete much-needed renovations on the Main Campus. The Board remains committed to maintaining the quality and standards of all four of our divisions.

We are pleased to report that, with a wildly successful Gala, St. Francis will be able to make improvements to the Main Campus library over the summer, in addition to funding technology and security needs.

The Board has also worked to control costs, raising tuition by 3.8 percent compared to an average tuition increase of 4.5 percent at other area independent schools. The Board will continue to focus on the overall

strategy of the school while entrusting our energetic head of school, Steve Lovejoy, with its operational management.

In closing, we look forward to unveiling the Strategic Plan with you and sharing more about *St. Francis 2025* on Tuesday, May 14—mark your calendars! We will have two sessions: one on the South Campus at 8:30 a.m. in the Primary School Crum Library, and one on the Main Campus at 6:00 p.m. in the Hogan Board Room. To accommodate those attending the evening session, pizza and child care will be available. A big thank-you to our [Strategic Planning Committee](#)—and each of you—whose input and time was critical in its creation.

From the Division Head

Parenting can be difficult. Families have busy schedules and very little discretionary time. The combination of work, raising children, staying connected with friends and family, volunteering, and trying to take care of yourself can be overwhelming. There's seldom time to read or research solutions for behavioral challenges that seem to present themselves at the most inopportune times.

I have very clear memories of some of the challenges I faced when my children were young. Guiding their behavior so that they would learn to be

responsible members of a community was important to me. I knew that the time I was investing in this guidance would be an investment in my children. It wasn't easy. Like all parents, I was tired and tempted to let things go because I lacked the energy to persist. But I knew there were risks in not being consistent. *Has this ever happened to you?*

Do you ever feel that, just as you've figured out what to do to redirect a behavior, your child has moved on to something else that is challenging?

Do you get embarrassed or overwhelmed when your child misbehaves in public and won't listen to you?

Are you concerned about manners or respectful behavior with others or unsure about what you should expect from your child?

If you answered "yes" to any of these questions, you are not alone!

That's why the second meeting in our spring parenting series will be about "Setting Limits and Healthy Boundaries." We'll meet casually in the Primary School Crum Library this Tuesday, April 16, from 8:30 to 9:20 a.m.

I hope you'll join me, and other Primary School parents, to share stories of successes and challenges in your parenting journey. I look forward to seeing you Tuesday morning.
