Over 15,000 Jewish children were sent by the Nazis to Theresienstadt, a former military camp, also known as Terezin. Tragically, only 100 children were still alive when the concentration camp was liberated at the end of World War II. *I Never Saw Another Butterfly* tells the true story of the children of Terezin and one of the camp's survivors, Raja Englanderova. There were no butterflies at Terezin, of course, but for the children, butterflies became a symbol of defiance, making it possible for them to live on and play happily while waiting to be transported to Auschwitz. This play is based on Raja's memories and, although it depicts the horrors of the Holocaust, it also reminds us of the best of which the human heart is capable.

## **Primary School**

### **From the Division Head**

In the Primary School we are always evaluating our practices. As we strive to improve our program and best serve our students, we look at our curriculum and all of the components that make up an appropriate learning environment for young children. Our teachers know what is necessary to help our students gain the most from their experiences each year. In our professional development meetings last year, our discussions often centered on one of the most valuable resources in schools: time.

As a Reggio-inspired program, we know that students need time in their classrooms to dig deeper into projects, work on developing relationships with their peers, and build connections between the content they are studying and the materials they are exploring. We also believe that when our teachers work together to integrate curriculum between our classrooms and our enrichment programs, the connection for children has deeper meaning.

In an effort to maximize the time our students have in the classroom and link our enrichment content, we made several changes to our class schedules this year.

Our students in Primary I and Primary II have two classes each week in the Spanish classroom and, once a week, Señora Schoelman joins students during their center rotations time to immerse students in Spanish in different

learning areas in the pod or classrooms. Conversations about their work with construction materials, dramatic play, or studio work deepen their understanding of the language through a natural approach.

Ms. Sweeney teaches each class once weekly in her classroom and also works with students during their rotations time. She helps enrich their skills with puppets, with dramatic play, and even with the storytelling dramatization that is an integral part of our literacy curriculum.

This immersion and integration of content in the students' environment reduces the number of transitions each week and allows them to remain in their classrooms, with two of our enrichment teachers going to the students.

We continue to look for ways to enhance our curriculum and expose students to enriching opportunities, but we also value our children's time in their classrooms and recognize that frequent transitions are not beneficial. We will evaluate our practices this year through conversations with our teachers and ongoing professional development. Our goal is to honor our students' needs and the mission of our program. We want to avoid overscheduling children during the school day, just as you are careful to provide a balance for your children outside of the Primary School

## **A Note From the PS Clinic About Screenings**

St. Francis will be offering vision and hearing screenings for Primary School students who turned 4 years old on or before September 1, 2018. Screenings will occur on **Monday, October 29, and Tuesday, October 30.**

Here's what you need to know:

- State-certified screeners conduct the screenings during school hours.
- A copy of the results is provided for school files. Students who have not passed a screening will receive a referral form for follow-up with a physician or specialist.
- Students who wear glasses should bring them to school.
- We do not refer to the screening as a "test." Please help us by doing the same. The teachers will explain the process to our students, and they will discover that they are playing two games with the screeners.
- Screenings are non-diagnostic and not intended to be an equal alternative to an in-depth exam by a licensed physician or specialist.

### **Important Details About People for Others Day**

Our annual day of service, People for Others Day, is right around the corner!

**This year, on Monday, November 12, our students will serve our community through several different activities and lessons built around three pillars: childhood cancer, early childhood literacy, and veterans.** Our People for Others team has been working diligently to create projects that will not only give back to our community, but also encourage our students to have visceral connection to the day of service, be aware of the needs in the community around us, and truly understand and comprehend why being people for others is important.

Throughout the day, each grade will participate in a variety of service-focused activities created specifically for each age group and geared toward their level of emotional maturity.

Everyone will begin the day with a grade-level presentation to discuss the purpose for this day of service and to introduce their activities and the beneficiaries of the service projects.

- Each grade will create something specific to accompany the books being collected during the book drive—whether it be designing a personalized bookmark, filling LEGO bags for STEM programs, or creating encouraging cards to be given to the mobile libraries of Making It Better and Houston Public Library’s Curiosity Cruiser.
- Our students will also participate in service projects focused on helping and honoring the local veterans at the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center, as well as deployed troops across the world. We will discuss the honor, privileges, and sacrifices of military families, and how important it is for all of us to appreciate and be aware of the courage and commitment our troops. Each grade will create some form of gratitude either to be given locally or to be shipped overseas to bring uplifting messages and kind words to our women and men who are currently fighting or who have previously protected our country and freedom.
- Each grade will also participate in either writing heartfelt and encouraging cards OR creating activity bags to be given to families at the Ronald McDonald House and to young patients at Texas Children’s Hospital and MD Anderson Cancer Center.

**Below is a brief description of each grade-level activity.**

## **KINDERGARTEN**

- Tour the Houston Public Library’s “Super Library on Wheels,” the Curiosity Cruiser.
- Decorate and fill bags of donated toiletries.
- Write thankful and upbeat cards to be given to our local veterans and their families at Texas Children’s Hospital.
- Design and create a personalized bookmark to accompany the donated books.

## **FIRST GRADE**

- Create a handmade “United We Stand” flag to be presented to the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center.
- Write a heartfelt letter to be sent to our deployed troops.
- Create “Bags of Smiles” for the patients at Texas Children’s Hospital. (Assemble craft kits, and create a 10-page journal to include in the bag, along with some Play-Doh and crayons to encourage creativity while the patients are in the hospital.)
- Create LEGO gift bags for mobile libraries to give out to their participants.

## **SECOND GRADE**

- Create superhero capes to be presented to Texas Children’s Hospital for in-patient children.
- Create and personalize a bookmark to be donated along with the book-drive books.
- Write a letter of gratitude to a veteran, to be distributed at the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center.

## **THIRD GRADE**

- Count, sort, box, and label our collected books from the book drive.
- Create a “Thank You, Veterans” sign.
- Make “prayer bags” containing a short prayer along with a plastic army man. (The prayer bags will be distributed to every student in the Lower School to help remind our students to pray for the soldiers who are making great sacrifices to fight for our freedom and our country.)
- Make no-sew fleece blankets and write uplifting letters to be given to the patients and families at the Ronald McDonald House.

## **FOURTH GRADE**

- Facetime with Commander Michael G. Mercado, MD, of the US Navy.

- Package student-designed holiday cards and stamps to create a gift bag for in-patients at the Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center, so they have cards to send to their own families.
- Write a letter of gratitude and encouragement to our deployed troops, veterans, and new recruits.
- Make no-sew fleece blankets and create handwritten notes for pediatric cancer patients at Texas Children's Hospital and MD Anderson Cancer Center.
- Assemble and decorate activity booklets designed by our students.
- Create a LEGO Character Creation Kit, which will be packaged and donated to the mobile libraries to be utilized in the STEM and STEAM programs they host in the community.

Although we call this People for Others Day, we feel it is valuable to teach our children to be givers and encourage them to help others as often as possible beyond just this one day.

We began our season of service in September, which is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, by hosting the first People for Others Spare Change Challenge. In just two weeks, the SFES community collectively accumulated over \$2,000 in change. The money collected will directly benefit the Candlelighters - Childhood Cancer Family Alliance, which will be presented with a check from our school in an upcoming Chapel service.

This month, we will be kicking off our two-week Gently Used Book Drive, collecting used books from our students and St. Francis community to be donated directly to the Curiosity Cruiser and Making It Better. Last year, we collected over 4,000 books during the two-week drive. This year, the bar is set high, and we know our community will pull together to collect a record-breaking number.

On People for Others Day, each Lower School grade will create something specific to accompany the books being collected during the book drive. This year, our collections will be given directly to two local nonprofit literacy programs:

- The Curiosity Cruiser is a mobile library providing free books and other educational programs to children in the Greater Houston area.
- Making It Better provides several different literacy programs to local communities and schools, including mentoring, after-school programming, and a mobile classroom providing early literacy programming to our youngest Houstonians.

### **People for Others Day LS Book Drive Starts Tomorrow**

**Donate your gently used books between Monday, October 29, and Friday, November 9.** There will be collection bins in the pods and/or classrooms for the next two weeks. We are collecting board books for babies, early readers and chapter books for elementary-aged students, and young adult novels for middle schoolers.

The 4,000+ books that SFES collected last year for Books Between Kids were sent out to many Houston communities after Harvey. Way to go, Wolves!

This year's book drive will benefit two local nonprofits: Making It Better and the Houston Public Library's Curiosity Cruiser. The Making It Better organization transforms communities by empowering children and families to build their literacy, leadership, and life skills. The Houston Public Library's Curiosity Cruiser seeks to improve the quality of life for Houston children by providing free books and a fun, safe library on wheels where they can learn and read with other children in the community.

As we approach the holidays, this is a great opportunity to work together as a SFES family, extend our love for reading and literacy into local communities, and reconnect with people in our neighborhood and around us as we go out, collect books, and be people for others.

- ALL 4 year olds
- All kindergarteners
- All children in first, third, fifth, and seventh grades
- If your child wears glasses or contacts, please make sure they have them on the day of the screenings.

### **TYPE 2 DIABETES IN CHILDREN (ACANTHOSIS NIGRICANS OR AN) SCREENING**

- All children in first, third, fifth, and seventh grades are required to receive the AN screening.
- Please note that this is NOT a blood test. It is completely noninvasive.

### **ADDITIONAL NOTES**

- A copy of the results will be provided for school files. If your child has not passed a screening, results will either be left at the school or be mailed to the school with a referral form showing detailed results.
- The screenings are non-diagnostic and not intended to be equal alternatives to an in-depth examination by a licensed physician or specialist.
