## **Primary School**

### **From the Division Head**

This summer I read Oprah Winfrey's book *What I Know for Sure*. In it, Oprah covers lots of foundational topics, like joy, resilience, connection, gratitude, and possibilities. She tells stories and reflects on what she knows to be true in her life. This was all prompted by her interview of the late *Chicago*

*Tribune* movie critic Gene Siskel in 1998. As the interview came to an end, he turned the tables and asked her, “What do you know for sure?”

This is **what I know for sure** (some tongue-in-cheek) after my first year living in Houston:

- I live (just) outside the loop ... people seem to use that as a central point to determine where everything is located. It helps to have a sense of direction and to know where everything is directionally: north, south, east, and west matter. You can't say, “I live near....” It's a big city, and I am learning how to navigate the city (with the help of Google Maps).
- There is a lot to do in Houston. The museums, restaurants, and antique shops are my favorites.
- The Astros play amazing baseball. I had the good fortune of watching Alex Bregman play at LSU, and it's hard to believe, but he's even better now! (*Geaux, Astros!*)
- The rodeo is a big deal here. I am seriously considering buying pink boots. I saw lots of them in Primary School last year and hope that they come in adult sizes, too.
- People in Texas don't seem to eat grits like they do in Louisiana, but they do eat a lot of breakfast tacos (thank you), and egg dishes always come with salsa.
- Everyone goes to H-E-B on Sunday afternoon. If I can't get there before 2:30 p.m., I have to make other plans. When you see police officers directing traffic there, it's not a good sign.

And this is **what I know for sure about St. Francis** after my first year as head of Primary School:

- People here really care about one another. Our mission of helping our students become people for others is modeled by everyone in the community. This was especially evident in what we saw after Hurricane Harvey. At this one-year anniversary, people are continuing to move forward. Their resilience is impressive.
- Being in a faith-based school is important to our families. Our worship with children is authentic and age-appropriate, and this ministry extends beyond our chapel services each week.
- Having the opportunity to share South Campus with Upper School is exciting. I have seen firsthand the work that has gone into planning and opening this new division, and I can't wait to begin our partnership with them.

- Teachers in the Primary School work really hard, and they love what they do. They are creative and always generating ideas to make our program better. I am inspired by them every day. School-wide, we are being intentional in making connections between divisions, because we know it is important that we know our colleagues. We believe that being engaged in what our students are doing now is of utmost importance, but we are also mindful of what comes next for them. There is a palpable enthusiasm and spirit in the school that is positive and uplifting.
- At St. Francis, we “*Challenge What’s Possible.*” This means stretching beyond our comfort zone, thinking differently, trying new things ... and encouraging students to do the same.

**What I know for sure is that this is a wonderful place for children.** I look forward to the possibilities ahead for our students and school.

**One more addition to our third- and fourth-grade program will be Lunch Bunch.** This is a time set aside for students who wish to attend a read-aloud book club during lunch. Mrs. McColloch and Mrs. Salinas will conduct Lunch Bunch for third grade, while Mrs. Stephenson and I will host lunch bunch for fourth grade. Students will get their lunch in the Dining Hall as usual and then join us in the library for some great reading and discussion. **Lunch Bunch will start this Thursday and will be held each Monday and Thursday after that.**

### **From the Division Head**

We've had another wonderful week of learning and team building in the Upper School. This week included a science lab, cross-country practices, Spanish presentations, explorations of humanities research, math discussions, two volleyball games, computer setup, personal reflection activities, discussions about the purpose of an education, and four days of rehearsal for the fall musical (*The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*). The pace is definitely quickening!

As we discussed during Parent Orientation a couple of weeks ago, we want to avoid overscheduling our children/students. That said, part of the excitement of being a member of the founding freshman class is getting to be involved in the gamut of activities offered right from the beginning. Please know that we recognize that this tension exists. Please also **feel free to reach out to us for assistance as you work to determine a level of involvement that is best suited to your child's and to your family's unique set of needs and preferences.**

By the end of the day on Tuesday or Wednesday (depending on how you are calculating), we will have completed two weeks with our new high school routine. **I encourage you to find a time during this four-day weekend or the coming week to check in as a family about the experience thus far.** How much time is homework taking each night? Are there opportunities for increased student-teacher communication and support that could be accomplished during our designated tutorial times?

**Recently, I stumbled upon a podcast series that I thoroughly enjoy.** It's called *NAIS Member Voices* and features interviews with educators from various members of the National Association of Independent Schools. **The**

**interview with Ann Klotz, head of school at Laurel School in Ohio, was particularly intriguing to me.** She mentions preferring the word “sequencing” to “balance” both for her own reflections and in her conversations with students. She explains that achieving balance has been an elusive goal and frequently leaves her feeling defeated. In contrast, sequencing allows for a regular reshuffling of priorities and reinforces what researcher Carol Dweck refers to as a growth mindset.
