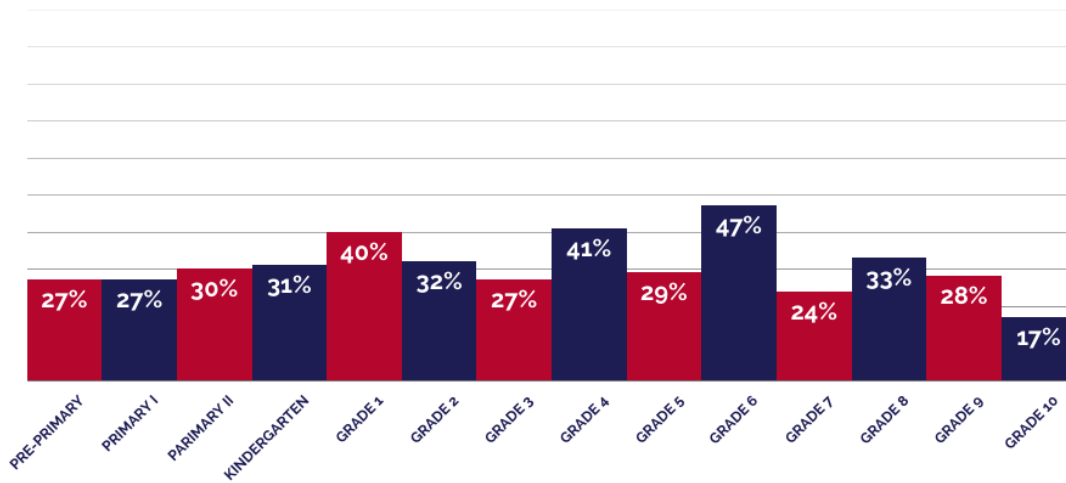

Primary School

From the Division Head

Over the years, I've shared with parents my belief that the easiest conference a teacher could have with parents would be to simply say, "Everything is perfect." But that would be dishonest. As professionals, we have to look at ourselves in the mirror each day and know that we have done our best to help support children's growth. Sometimes that means having courageous conversations.

We all have what have become known as "growth edges." For adults, our growth edges may be in our personal or professional lives. With children, those growth edges may be in social or emotional development, in fine or gross motor skills, in the acquisition of speech or language skills, or in the academic arena. There is room for growth in all of us.

I remember well what it felt like as a parent to attend a conference about my children's progress at school. My daughter was a "pleaser" and a very committed student. But I knew she wasn't perfect, and I never wanted her to believe that, or think we expected that of her. There were areas of growth that I knew were there, and I appreciated knowing that her teachers knew her well enough to recognize those, too. But I also trusted that, as her teachers, they saw her through a different lens. They knew what expectations were appropriate for her age, abilities, and stage of development in all domains. Her teachers focused on social and emotional growth to help her become more comfortable with taking risks and to help her trust that making mistakes was okay. She didn't have a demonstrative personality, but she observed and listened intently, so they encouraged her to share her thoughts and ideas with others. These qualities have served her very well in her career.

My son was language precocious; active; sometimes impulsive; and not very interested in writing, math, or the visual arts. He loved active learning, where he was able to ask lots of questions, experiment with materials, and investigate how things worked. As a high school student, his adept language

skills and sense of humor were assets in theatre productions and in engaging classroom conversations. His ongoing curiosity about people and different cultures has fueled his interest in education. He has empathy for students whose learning style resembles his own and will enter the teaching profession next year.

I am grateful that my children's teachers were honest with me about their growth edges. As sociologist and researcher Brené Brown says, "Let's have a real conversation, even if it's tough." In *Dare to Lead*, she refers to these conversations as a rumble. She defines a rumble as "a discussion, conversation, or meeting defined by a commitment to lean into vulnerability, to stay curious and generous, to stick with the messy middle of problem identification and solving, to take a break and circle back when necessary, to be fearless in owning our parts, and, as psychologist Harriet Lerner teaches, 'to listen with the same passion with which we want to be heard.'"

We look forward to spending time with you at parent-teacher conferences on Thursday, October 31, and sharing news of your child's growth this year.

Lower School

From the Curriculum and Instruction Specialist

Having authentic audiences with which to share new learning and work is crucial to students' academic and social-emotional growth—and is an essential component of our program. Students are so proud when sharing their work. Doing so promotes self-confidence and agency; helps build speaking and listening skills; gives meaning and purpose to hard work; and empowers students to have ownership of their learning. We also coach the children on how to provide constructive and positive feedback to one another in kind, purposeful ways.

Below, I've listed some ways that our students have been sharing their learning over the past few weeks, as well as upcoming opportunities they'll have to share their work:

- **Kindergarten:** Recently, our little friends shared their learning about fairy tales with a “Fairy Tale Expert” celebration. You may have seen some “Fairy Tale Expert” stickers come home. Our kindergarteners truly are experts in retelling their favorite tales! Another celebration is coming soon, as next week, these students will be opening their very own book store to share their writing with others. Handwritten invitations have been delivered to all of our faculty members, so this is sure to be a hit! More to come after this exciting day!
- **First Grade:** Students in grade 1 kicked off their first reading celebration of the year by reading to their own stuffed animals in conjunction with our Blessing of the Animals. Then, the very next week, classes came together to share their personal narratives with peers and visiting faculty. Students practiced attentive listening skills as well as asking questions and complimenting one another on their hard work.
- **Second Grade:** To celebrate the end of their first reading unit, second graders invited kindergartners to visit their classrooms so they could read to them. What a wonderful way to showcase their reading skills and act as reading role models! Last week, each second-grade class partnered with another second-grade class to share their personal narratives. Each second grader had the opportunity to share his or her piece with at least three peers.
- **Third Grade:** We celebrated more student writing two weeks ago in the third-grade pod. Students showcased their “Small Moment” stories by sharing them with small groups of peers and faculty members. They

paid close attention to “craft moves” learned by studying mentor texts and worked hard to present their pieces with clear and confident voices.

- **Fourth Grade:** Just this week, our fourth graders celebrated the publication of their five-paragraph literary essays—no small feat for a learner of any age! Students worked hard to identify and defend their thoughts on theme, character traits, and character motivations in literature, and they shared their work with peers in a “gallery walk.” Readers were invited to leave compliments for each piece, and everyone felt a great sense of accomplishment!

We are constantly amazed with the academic strides of your children—and having an audience with whom to share this learning is icing on the cake!

It is inevitable that kids will forget things, and I challenge you to empathize with their worries and then empower them to find *their* best solution that does not include you visiting campus.

Opportunities like these offer moments of growth that cannot be replicated. It is true that there might be a proverbial “fall,” but as I recently heard from a colleague, “The ground is soft at St. Francis,” and Middle School stumbles

rarely lead to life-altering consequences. For our kids, learning how to navigate mistakes and disappointment will equip them with a sense of self-efficacy and help them grow into increasingly responsible and capable young adults.
