From the Assistant Director of Library Services

Have you ever heard talk about “makerspaces” and “tinkering” from your children and wondered what they were talking about? This year, we’ve added tinkering to our studio spaces as a way to expand our students’ thinking. In addition to my role as a librarian, I am working with groups of students to explore, discover, test ideas, and invent through engineering.

A makerspace is a designated area within a school, office, library, or home that allows participants to experiment, create, and design new things. These areas can include high-tech gadgets or even household items such as toilet paper rolls, shoeboxes, and old flashlights. In our Primary School, we are working to create designated areas for “making.” There is no one way to create a makerspace, and no two makerspaces are the same. The purpose of these spaces is to encourage creativity and give our students opportunities for problem-solving.

Tinkering happens in our makerspaces. Students explore materials available to them and have the opportunity to take apart everyday gadgets using real tools. This meaningful process helps to satisfy children’s curiosity about how things work. Primary School students have tinkered with flashlights, calculators, and scanners as a beginning to their explorations in our makerspaces.

Lower School

From the Division Head

I hope you have had a lovely weekend enjoying the cooler weather!

Part of our ongoing communication process with you is providing you with your child's **trimester report card**. It will be in My BackPack on **Monday, November 11**.

With this in mind, I thought now would be a great time to explain a bit about our assessment instrument and the standards by which your child is assessed. First, let me define a few "education" terms for you:

- **Assessment Instrument:** Any document used to provide feedback to students and/or parents
- **National Grade-Level Standards:** Standards that define the knowledge and skills students should have within their K–12 education careers so that they will graduate high school able to succeed in entry-level, credit-bearing academic college courses and in workforce training programs
- **St. Francis Standards:** Based on national standards
- **Objectives:** Specific learning goals correlated to larger standards
- **Benchmarks:** The expectation at a given time in a specific area of academic development
- **Indicators:** The descriptors that indicate where a child is performing in a specific object at a specific time
- **Norms:** A norm group is a nationally representative sample of several thousand students in the same grade at the same point in the school year.

We use a **standards-based assessment instrument with indicators given for each standard and objective**. This is common practice in most independent lower schools, as this provides a comprehensive picture of your child’s development in every facet of his or her educational development. The indicators on which your child is assessed on the standards are as follows: AS for Area of Strength, MS for Meeting Standards, PS for Progressing With Support (toward grade-level standards), and NS for Not Meeting Standards at this time.

You might be thinking, “Where do they get the grade-level standards?” Schools base their standards or grade-level benchmarks on a variety of standards and objectives. **We choose to use nationally based standards**—except with social studies, because there are no national social-study standards appropriate for lower school students. Therefore, we use the Texas state standards in this area. We also use norms from our standardized assessment, the CTP by ERB. This assessment is given in third and fourth grades, and we use this normed data to compare our students’ progress in our program with the progress of students in other independent schools across the world.

Additionally, part of our **re-accreditation process with Independent Schools of the Southwest (ISAS) and the Southwest Association of Episcopal Schools (SAES)** is to provide evidence that our programming is, indeed, standards based. We are actually going through the re-accreditation process this school year. It is quite rigorous and detail oriented, but it is a process that demands that we continually examine and update our practices and standards. All independent schools that are members of these accrediting agencies must adhere to these strict requirements, as well. If you are interested in reading our standards by subject, grade level, and correlation to our curriculum, please reach out to me. I am happy to share those documents with you.

Our reading and writing standards, or benchmarks, are **correlated to the national Common Core standards**. These standards guide our instruction and assessments, which are delivered via the Units of Study for Reading and Writing from Teachers College, Columbia University. Every grade level has a band of reading and writing

levels (based on national norms) that we use as our school benchmarks. Children who are reading on those levels and utilizing appropriate comprehension, fluency, and rate are “Meeting Standards” for “comprehends texts at grade level.” If they are slightly below that benchmark, they are “Progressing With Support.” If your child is reading fluently, at an appropriate rate, and comprehending above the grade level benchmarks, that would be considered an “Area of Strength.”

We know that all children develop at a variety of rates and may even have a tremendous rate of progress and then stall out for a bit. This is completely normal; we must look at each child’s growth as individuals while maintaining grade-level benchmarks as goals. By providing the content objectives under each subject standard, you can get a comprehensive picture of how your child is progressing in each content area. A grade-based system would give a grade of 88 in reading, for example, but it doesn’t give any indication of how your child is developing in the many facets (objectives) of reading development.

Our **Bridges in Mathematics** learning objectives are also based on the national Common Core standards. If children are understanding and demonstrating knowledge of the mathematical concepts of a particular grade level, they are, indeed, “Meeting Standards.” If they are working in a more advanced group, that is an “Area of Strength.” If a child needs extra support to master grade-level material, he or she may receive a “Progressing With Support” for math concepts.

Our STEAM, music, art, and Spanish curriculum standards are based off of national standards, as well.

As far as **Approaches to Learning** and **Social-Emotional Learning**, your child’s content teachers confer and agree upon indicators for every child. These are the standards the enrichment team uses to evaluate your child in his or her class. A great deal of effort is made to ensure you receive a comprehensive snapshot of your child’s progress in all areas of school life.

Your child’s narratives, written by his or her teachers, should provide an explanation of the standards, objectives, and indicators on the report cards. If you have questions about where your child is performing in an area, do not hesitate to reach out to his or her teachers. They are always happy to discuss your child with you!

From the Technology Department

Teaching St. Francis ninth and tenth graders has been an interesting and exciting experience, to say the least. We had the opportunity to develop classes in which students learned programming concepts, JavaScript, and the language of the web (in ninth grade) as well as Python, a versatile programming language (in tenth grade).

Our tenth graders’ final project was to create an application in Python. It was amazing to see the range of ideas and skills the class acquired over the course of the trimester.

Having fundamental programming techniques under their belts, our students have the tools to learn any other programming language in the future. We also wanted our students to have real-world problems to solve and relevant projects to create. In both classes, the students were encouraged to find solutions to problems they encountered on their own prior to coming to us for answers, practicing persistence and perseverance through obstacles—an important skill in any class.

We look forward to future opportunities to engage with these talented students, collaborating on exciting projects and solving intriguing problems.
