### **Dress Uniform Reminder**

As a reminder, Mondays are dress uniform days. Periodically, we will have additional dress uniform days and will communicate them to you here in *Wolf Watch*. We have had some inconsistency in student apparel on these days and have included below the dress uniform guidelines, taken from the *Middle School Handbook*.

## **DRESS UNIFORM—GIRLS, GRADES 5–8**

- Navy blazer
- Khaki skirts with sewn-down pleats (no more than two inches above the knee)
- Dress shoes should be navy, black, or brown with a closed toe and heel (hiking boots and athletic shoes are not dress shoes)
- Blue oxford shirt with button-down collar (short- or long-sleeved)
- Plaid school tie or eighth-grade tie
- Crew dress socks (white or navy); no low-cut socks
- White or navy tights (no texture or design)
- Hair bows and headbands must be solid navy blue, red, or white in color

## **DRESS UNIFORM—BOYS, GRADES 5–8**

- Navy blazer
- Khaki trousers
- Blue oxford shirt with button-down collar (short- or long-sleeved)
- School tie
