All School

Three Important Changes on the Horizon

As we wrap up the 2019–20 school year, we wanted to let you know about a few changes that we will be working on over the summer and implementing for 2020–21. These exciting transitions have been made with an eye toward further improving the St. Francis experience for all.

CAMPUS NAME CHANGE

First, beginning this July, and with the approval of the St. Francis Episcopal School Board of Trustees and the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, we are renaming our campuses. We are doing this to reflect the equal roles they play in our present educational endeavors and to honor those whose past contributions have been invaluable in shaping St. Francis into something truly special. This change also supports the "Community of Inclusion" goal of our strategic plan by recognizing the importance of all of our divisions to the inclusive St. Francis experience.

- Our Main Campus will be renamed the **Piney Point Village Campus**—or Piney Point (PP), for short—to honor the community that has nurtured our school for more than 60 years.
- Our South Piney Point Campus will be renamed the **Mary Frances Bowles Couper Campus**—or Couper Campus (CC), for short—in honor of the family whose generosity made our school's second campus possible.

UNIFORM PROVIDER UPDATE

Back in December, we let you know that we had chosen DENNIS Uniform as our exclusive uniforms partner for the 2020–21 school year. DENNIS has a reputation for excellent quality, value, and customer satisfaction, and we expect the transition to be very easy. The online ordering process is almost finalized, and we will be sending you details on how to order soon. Stay tuned!

NEW SIS SOFTWARE

We will be replacing My BackPack with Veracross, student information system (SIS) software that should provide parents and students with a smoother, more robust, and more efficient way to access information online. We'll be sharing more details with you later in the year, but expect improvements in grade and attendance reporting, summer and after-school course registration, directory access, and more.

From the Division Head

The school weeks since spring break have been different than any of us have ever experienced. It's not how we expected the year to be, but we've learned a lot about distance learning and ways to stay connected to you, our families. It seems like everyone had a role in helping to support children's learning this year. Whether you are

a professionally trained teacher, or learning along with your children, we know this has been a challenging time.

You may have heard educators or counselors refer to the “summer slide.” This is not something that should cause you concern. Fortunately, our teachers are able to quickly re-engage students when school resumes each fall. The coming school year will be no different. But, if you are looking for resources to support a wide variety of learning experiences and extend enrichment opportunities for you and your child, you may find the websites below helpful.

- [PBS Kids](#) is a collection of games, activities, and encounters with favorite book characters like Curious George and Clifford the Big Red Dog. Some of the games feature practice with Spanish vocabulary. There is a section specifically designed for preschool-aged children.
- [The Smithsonian Institute](#) has a wealth of information available in the form of games, simulations, and a range of STEM activities that promote problem-solving. The site is recommended for students in K–8, but some activities would be of interest to younger children.
- [Scholastic Learn at Home: Day-by-Day Projects to Keep Kids Reading, Thinking, and Growing](#) provides four weeks of plans for “play with a purpose.” In addition to activities that coordinate with quality children’s literature, there are PreK–K activities centered on movement and games, science and nature, and art and imaginative play.
- **Read!** Reading aloud to young children impacts their language development, contributes to the acquisition of rich vocabulary, helps to extend memory, and sparks curiosity. Research shows that children who are read to often have stronger parent-child relationships. Even after they have learned to read on their own, children benefit from hearing books read to them by their parents.

Most importantly, cherish summer. Make homemade ice cream, sleep in a tent, roast marshmallows, and run through the sprinkler. Eat popsicles and watermelon, and go barefoot. Summers are a special and meaningful time for children and families.

We are working hard now, and will continue to do so throughout the summer, as we plan for your child’s next steps at St. Francis. Thank you for sharing your children with us this year. We are honored to be a part of their young lives and privileged to see them grow up in the Primary School. **Our faculty and staff look forward to waving to you when you return to campus to pick up your child’s belongings on Tuesday, May 26 (details below).** We’ll see you soon!

For summer to truly begin, we will need your help and continued partnership. **On Wednesday, May 27, Middle School administration and faculty will be on campus to facilitate the return of your child's possessions and to collect school property.** Our procedure and time windows for this exchange are outlined below.

PROCEDURE FOR EXCHANGING STUDENT MATERIALS

1. The following items need to be in your trunk, placed in separate bags that are labeled with your child's name and grade level:
 - Bag of textbooks
 - Bag of library books
 - Bag of school computers and chargers
 - Bag of athletic equipment and uniforms (please label with team/sport)
2. Please help us ensure this process runs safely and smoothly by doing the following:
 - Clearly displaying your carpool sign on your dashboard
 - Entering campus through the north driveway (by the church)
 - Remaining in your vehicle and opening your trunk when you stop at your pickup location
3. Middle School faculty and staff will put student materials, labeled with your child's name, in your trunk. We have completely cleaned out your child's locker and everything—including shelving—will be in a large contractor bag.

PICKUP LOCATIONS AND TIMES

- All families should enter campus via the north driveway (by the church) and proceed as indicated by signage and school staff.
- The materials exchange for **grades 5 and 7** will take place at the **MS afternoon pickup location near the Dining Hall**.
