Upper School

From the Interim Head of Upper School

On Wednesday, the Upper School carried out a St. Francis tradition that binds together all members of our student body, across four divisions. Students wore formal dress uniforms, gathered for Chapel, and signed the St. Francis Honor Code. Director of School Counseling Ted Lakoski delivered a moving homily on what it means to be an honorable person. I hope you will ask your student to tell you about this service.

The Honor Code shapes all our lives at St. Francis, starting with our youngest learners in the Primary School. They are introduced to a simplified version of the Honor Code, known as The St. Francis Way. It emphasizes the importance of four basic expectations, as follows:

- Listen carefully to teachers and friends.
- Be kind to others.
- Be safe.
- Take care of our school.

While the expectations for Lower, Middle, and Upper School are known by another name—the St. Francis Honor Code—they are really no different:

St. Francis Honor Code

As a citizen of St. Francis Episcopal School, I pledge to uphold the spirit of St. Francis of Assisi by respecting my school, myself, and my community; upholding honor; engaging in service; and striving to be courageous and faithful in all that I do and say.

St. Francis has a high standard for student honor that reflects positively on self, family, school, and community. Students are expected to be courteous and polite and to treat others with dignity and respect. Our Honor Code governs our standards for ethical and moral conduct. A system of expectations concerning one's inner character and one's moral and ethical structure, it recognizes that each of us possesses the capability to discern what is morally and ethically right and the ability to choose between right and wrong. Honor is ultimately a matter of personal responsibility.

In an Advisory assembly this week, our discussion of honor extended to each of us being a reflection of our family and our school, even when we are not on campus. Years ago, one of my friends said something similar to her three children each time they left her home. Her daily parting words to them were, "Remember, you're a Westbrook." It was important to her that her children knew that, as a family, they were all connected, and how they handled themselves in the community mattered to everyone in the family. It's like that at St. Francis. We support one another, but we also have high expectations for every member of the family. The actions of one impact all of us.

Each student and faculty and staff member has pledged to abide by the Honor Code. Like at home, our school community is at its best when we are truthful, respect one another, make thoughtful decisions, and take personal responsibility for our actions. I'm especially proud of our students and their commitment to upholding the values of the St. Francis Honor Code.

How to Watch Sunday Service Via Livestream

If you would like to join St. Francis Episcopal Church's **9:00 a.m.** or **11:00 a.m.** Sunday service via livestream, here's how to watch:

1. Open an Internet browser on your computer, laptop, or phone. Type in the St. Francis website—sfch.org.
2. Click on the “**Watch Live Stream**” button. Choose to watch from the website or from Facebook or YouTube.
3. Prelude music will begin on the livestream 10 minutes prior to the service to allow time for your connection and for your inspiration. If you miss the live video, a recording of the service will also be available on St. Francis's [YouTube channel](#).
