Primary School

From the Primary School Spanish Teacher

One benefit of learning Spanish in Primary School is the inclusion of the culture when making connections between classroom project work, songs, holidays, and school events. During class, students participate in games, projects, dances, and songs. They are encouraged to apply their learning, which motivates them, helps them feel proud, and increases their confidence when using Spanish.

There are numerous examples of Spanish immersion throughout the Primary School. Examples include having the “mercado” (or marketplace) with Primary II in the spring; cooking tortillas with Primary I; and reading books, singing songs, and doing finger plays with Pre-Primary.

There are tons of benefits to learning a second language before the age of six. Doing so:

- Increases cognitive ability and focus;
- Improves communication capabilities;
- Improves a child's ability in analytical and creative mathematics;
- Leads to more success with word problems and advanced concepts; and
- Creates strong neural connections, due to experiences in multiple languages.

Middle School

From the Division Head

During this second half of the school year, we know and appreciate how many of our students continue to be people for others even as service is more challenging in this

year of COVID protocols. St. Francis will continue to recognize students who serve their community. Please review the procedures below for how to track student service hours with the Middle School.

MIDDLE SCHOOL OUTREACH PHILOSOPHY

Middle School students are encouraged to serve their communities outside of school. St. Francis tracks students' service records and awards credit in terms of hours of service completed (service hours). As people for others, Middle School students are asked to take the initiative in discerning a need, choosing an activity to address the need, and arranging and following through on their response.

RECOGNITION OF SERVICE HOURS

St. Francis Episcopal School recognizes and celebrates students who give of their time and energy to serve others. Students who complete 25 or 50 hours of service during this school term will receive a certificate recognizing their effort. In addition, one graduating eighth-grade student is recognized for exemplifying and modeling a life of service and for being a "person for others."

'WITH DISTINCTION' REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Students completing the required number of service hours *during each of their years* in Middle School receive a "With Distinction" designation on their eighth-grade diploma.

In response to COVID-19, we have adjusted our service milestone hours for the 2020–21 school year. Service hour requirements for "distinction" are as follows:

- **Fifth Grade:** 5 hours
- **Sixth Grade:** 5 hours
- **Seventh Grade:** 10 hours
- **Eighth Grade:** 15 hours

Service hours may be earned and will be recognized by the school under the following guidelines:

- Students submit hours for approval to the chaplain or Middle School office manager by designated deadlines during the year. Approval of hours is at the discretion of Fr. Wismer. Fostering animals can receive a maximum of two hours per week.
- Hours must be submitted via the [2020–21 Community Service Hours form](#).
- Students who are new to St. Francis in sixth, seventh, or eighth grade may graduate "With Distinction" as long as they earn the required number of service hours for each grade level they complete at St. Francis.
- Service hours are restricted to eight hours per day. Students submitting more than 10 hours for one project may be asked to provide a day-by-day list of what was accomplished on each day and how many hours were worked each day.
- Athletic team managers will be credited a percentage of their actual time spent with the team (maximum 20 hours).

Upper School

From the Interim Head of Upper School

Opening day for baseball may be two months away, but the recent warm weather and news coverage of changes on the Astros' roster has me excited for the season ahead. I am a fan of baseball. I spent years watching games at Alex Box Stadium at LSU and, like many others, enjoyed the legacy of Coach Skip Bertman. Skip knew how to attract talent, build a program and, of course, win!

Coach Bertman won five College World Series championships in his years at LSU. Along with building a storied baseball program, he believed in finding a way to bring families to the stadium.

He built a loyal fan base. Even though Bertman retired as coach in 2001, LSU continues to benefit from his legacy and, to this day, is the only school in the history of the National Collegiate Athletic Association to exceed 400,000 baseball attendees in a season.

My nephew traveled from Florida every summer from the time he was probably 7 or 8 until he was in high school to attend Skip's summer camps. These camps were packed with kids who wanted to be part of something led by this coach. I showed up for the closing ceremonies each year to hear Skip speak. My daughter still teases me about taking notes. (It's true, I did!) Skip was a storyteller, and his words are still profound to me. He spoke about players he had coached and what it means to be part of a team. He typically had one of those former players—then playing in the major leagues—speak to the impact of education, commitment, and hard work. And, like Skip, they had stories to tell.

One of my favorite Skip stories focused on his approach to recruiting players. It's one I reminded my own children of many times. He said that when he was scouting students in high school, there were some things he always looked for. He liked to show up early and watch players getting off the bus, as they arrived for a game. He wanted to see who got off the bus first, and who wore their hat facing forward. Skip believed these were both indicators of the kind of players he wanted on his team. They were winners. He said that he could teach players how to play baseball, but it was the character of those players that mattered most to him. That character came from their families.

I like that. It's the way you want your children to be when you're not there to "coach" them.

Teachers, coaches, and parents working together to model the character we wish to see in our students is time well spent. This is an investment we make for the future. The alternative would be to just hope they learn on their own—without guidance. Everyone benefits from coaching!
