Dr. Crystal Collier to Address Eighth-Grade Students This Wednesday

This Wednesday, May 12, our eighth-grade students will be participating in a presentation by Dr. Crystal Collier on the effects of engaging in high-risk behaviors—particularly vaping and the use of alcohol. As our students look forward to high school, Dr. Collier will be reviewing the research associated with addictive substances such as alcohol and nicotine to highlight their effect on adolescent brain development.

- Dr. Collier, herself in long-term recovery, is a therapist, an educator, and the director of BrainAbouts. She has been working with adolescents and adults suffering from mental illness, behavioral problems, and substance-use disorders since 1991. Her areas of expertise include adolescent brain development, prevention programming, parent coaching, addiction, family-of-origin work, and training new clinicians. She possesses a bachelor's degree in psychology, a master's degree in clinical psychology, and a doctorate in counselor education.

From the Division Head

When your children were toddlers, you knew that they learned the most by doing things on their own. The familiar, "I do it myself," was a call for independence. Their attempts to "help" by sweeping, measuring flour, and washing dishes resulted in extra cleanup on your part. And their demands to dress themselves meant waiting patiently on the day you were already late for work.

Last weekend, the fruits of your parenting labors were realized. Fifty-three Upper School students presented us with *The Crucible*—following months of rehearsals, including nights and long weekends; the demanding technical work required to stage an outdoor, evening performance in the woods; and torrential rain and rising water last week that amplified the challenges inherent in building a stage located across the bayou.

A dress rehearsal on the outdoor stage Thursday night was followed by completely relocating the production to the gym for a Saturday night performance. All day Saturday, cast members and volunteers covered the muddy surfaces with hay, built platforms as a base for audience seating, and spread mulch along pathways so that a Sunday night performance could return to the outdoor stage.

Each performance, the culmination of students' rehearsals and preparation, was impressive. But what I am left with is the vision of months of work leading up to a very full weekend of challenges and solutions. The most growth has taken place in the lessons learned along the way. We call this "process versus product." Perseverance, resilience, creativity, and collaboration were visible in our students' work.

Our approach to learning in the Upper School honors the process—the journey—of learning. Real-world problems were present last weekend, and our students helped solve them. Congratulations to all of our cast members, plus to Justin Doran, Torsten

Louis, Krissy Richmond, and Caroline Doyle for your leadership and commitment to our students. Bravo!
