Primary School

From the Primary I Lead Teachers

Children learn how to write in the same way they learn to walk. It happens in stages. A child may first learn how to sit up, crawl, and stand before they eventually learn to walk. In a similar way, children will naturally hold crayons in a different way as their hand and arm muscles strengthen.

First, they might try holding a crayon with a closed fist using their shoulders to make marks on a paper. Then they may move to a palmar grasp, where they use their fingers, pointing them down toward the paper. Next, they might grasp the crayon using their index, middle, and thumb digits, still dependent on the wrist for movement. Eventually, children will be able to use their fingers and thumb to move the crayon using a tripod grasp. In this stage, a child will be able to write and draw with detail.

In Primary I, you might see your child progressing from making lines and swirls on paper to writing their name, copying letters and numbers, and even drawing themselves or their family and friends.

We provide many fine-motor activities, routines, and opportunities that involve writing in the classroom. In addition, we model writing by recording news, storytelling, taking group stories, creating lists as a class when brainstorming a project, and creating class books.

There are also opportunities for the teacher and child to write together and independently. The students may sign in by writing their names and may also copy posted words, as well as write words. Each classroom has a writing center with various writing tools to facilitate such learning.

Your child can do the following activities to strengthen fine-motor skills at home:

- Paint using brushes, squeezing pipettes, or droppers.
- Pick up and transfer pom-poms using tongs or tweezers.
- Help bake cookies by scooping, pouring, stirring, rolling dough into balls, and piping icing.
- String beads on pipe cleaners or thread.
- Thread fabric strips or straws through holes in cardboard.
- Peel painter's tape off of a surface.
- Open and close snack bags.
- Roll, flatten, cut, and squeeze play dough.
- Zip and unzip zippers.
- Cut paper.

We are grateful to work with our Primary I children as they become empowered writers, and we look forward to their exponential growth this school year.

A Note From Ms. Nguyen, Fourth-Grade Math Teacher

“We don’t need students to calculate quickly in math. We need students who can ask good questions, map out pathways, reason about complex solutions, set up models, and communicate in different forms.” —Jo Boaler, author and professor of mathematics education

For generations, math curricula have been designed in favor of a certain type of learner—one who can memorize and calculate quickly. However, every student is created with individual strengths and gifts and deserves to learn in a setting that values all types of learners.

With this in mind, combined with findings from brain research, educators have developed content and strategies that target critical, divergent thinking rather than just procedural competency.

This is not to say that memorization of content (i.e., math facts) is not valuable. Rather, it is a step toward being able to think deeply about math. Today’s math emphasizes reasoning, problem-solving, and creativity—all elements that are required in our world’s ever-changing landscape of post-education life.

Bridges in Mathematics, Lower School’s research-based math curriculum, incorporates these elements through hands-on exploration, real-life problem-solving projects, and game play where students learn to work collaboratively as math concepts and standards are reinforced. Students develop multiple strategies for a single solution, fortifying their depth of understanding and their ability to assess for efficacy and efficiency.

Math is a multi-dimensional subject built for multi-dimensional students, and the way we teach math at St. Francis embraces this fact.

From the Division Head

This has been a very challenging week for the St. Francis community. As individuals have worked through myriad thoughts and emotions surrounding the tragic loss of a student in our Upper School, I have witnessed a sense of camaraderie and solidarity among our Middle School students and faculty. The support our community members have offered one another has been a bright spot in a difficult time.

Throughout the week, we have made counselors available to talk with students and staff who needed to process their thoughts and feelings. Mr. Lakoski, Fr. Wismer, Coach T, and others will continue to be available to students seeking a trusted adult.

The death of a peer often brings up challenging questions for kids, and you may find yourself having discussions about suicide, death, and self-harm with your child in the days and weeks ahead. To help equip you for these conversations, we are taking the steps outlined below:

- This Monday, Dr. Crystal Collier will be making a special presentation to our seventh- and eighth-grade students.
- On Wednesday, Dr. Collier will be conducting a session for parents at 7:45 a.m. during our scheduled Middle School Parent meeting.

In addition to resources like Dr. Collier, we are fortunate to have Mr. Lakoski and Dr. Curtis on our team. Please read the letter from Mr. Lakoski, below, for some specific resources and advice for parents on how to talk with their child about suicide and self-harm.

Message From Director of School Counseling Ted Lakoski

The sudden loss of a beloved student in our school community to suicide has left all of us in shock and disbelief. Unfortunately, this tragedy is being replayed throughout schools across the country—as depression, anxiety, and suicide rates in young people are on the rise. The best defense against this mental health crisis is knowing the

symptoms and warning signs to look for in our children. **Please join us for Dr. Collier's parent presentation on Wednesday, October 27, at 7:45 a.m.** It will be an eye-opening talk and a good launching point for more discussion.

Additionally, please take the time to check out the following resources, which will offer guidance on how to talk to your child about death and suicide. These are hard conversations on topics that none of us would ever imagine having with our children. However, hard conversations are what are needed to help keep our kids safe.

Upper School

Message From the Head of Upper School

This has been a devastating week for our community. For many of our students, this is the first time that someone they know has passed, and of course so many students knew Alex intimately. It has been doubly difficult for our students, because Alex had such a profound impact on our community. He was a leader and took time to know all at our school—it seems that everywhere you look, you can find something Alex built or a place where he was prominent.

I want to let you know what last week looked like. We began the day Tuesday with a school assembly, and with permission from Alex's parents, told the students that Alex had passed by suicide. While we were still going to hold classes, we let students know that they did not have to attend. They could gather and talk with one another; they could speak with counselors; and lastly, they could talk with teachers and administrators. On Wednesday, the school shortened class periods and invited Dr. Crystal Collier, who specializes in adolescent brain development and trauma experiences, to speak to our students, parents, and faculty and staff. Counselors were still available to students for them to talk with at any time in the day.

We are so grateful to River Oaks Baptist, Duchesne, and Kinkaid for sending their school counselors to help with our students this week.

One of the hardest things for adolescents to understand is why we strive to return to normalcy. *Does the school understand what we're feeling? Do they care? How can we*

be expected to function? And that's just it. We all process grief differently. Some students cannot be in class. For them, counselors will continue to be present for as long as needed. Some students need the structure of class; they need support; they need the ability to take their minds off what just happened.

But we all have to return to some sense of routine and normalcy. In the coming days, it will be hard for those closest to Alex to emerge from their grief, and we hope that the upcoming celebrations and remembrance of Alex will help us begin to turn our sadness at his loss into gratitude for the many gifts he bestowed on us.

I am so proud of the St. Francis community in the wake of this tragedy. It has been humbling to see our community come together to support the Haug family and our students. There have been emails, phone calls, flowers, and food. Parents from all grades have stepped forward to volunteer. Our students have especially come together to support each other.

Speaking of students coming together—in what is a first for me—the seniors conspired to tacitly alter the uniform guidelines in tribute to Alex and to remember his patriotism. They decided that Wednesday would be a great day for wearing red, Thursday white, and Friday blue.

The first photo below shows Alex's senior parking space, where his love of the Texas flag is on proud display. In the second picture, students are wearing red and are gathered in front of the shed where Alex did so much work for our theater program.





Seeing this indomitable spirit in our students reminds me of the community that I saw on my visit last year, and why I knew St. Francis was a special place. Together, we will continue the path to healing and remembering, relying on each other and the community we hold dear.
