This past Monday, Primary I hosted its first Messy Monday of the school year. It was a collaborative effort between our Primary I teachers, children, and parents. Inspired by teaching assistant Veni Hardy, our large playscape was transformed into a launchpad for myriad creative activities. As I put on my rain boots and squelched onto the playscape, my heart swelled in anticipation of the magical time that awaited our children.

Each station was intentionally crafted with an array of materials. Stations included the mud kitchen, slippery slide, blob painting, dirt delight, sand sensation, and so much more. Careful consideration was given to each area of play and exploration. Watching the children delight in the opportunity to make choices and navigate with natural curiosity affirmed the magnitude of the moment. While observing these interactive spaces, I noticed children problem-solving, engaging in dialogue, concocting delicacies, taking risks, and celebrating each other's work. At home, you, too, can design outdoor spaces that encourage your child to imagine, investigate, and analyze. It does not take much. Grab some cooking utensils, sand, soil, plastic tubs, water, filters, etc., and watch your resourceful and confident child turn any day into a learning fun-day!
