The Nativity plays take the drama curriculum to the next level, challenging students to put all the skills they have learned into practice. They also continue to connect Primary Drama to the mission of St. Francis Episcopal Church.

From the Music Teacher

Christmas is coming, and our Lower School students are looking forward to celebrating the holiday season in concert! **Tomorrow—Monday, December 13—at 6:30 p.m.**, the much-anticipated All-School Christmas Concert returns to **Chapelwood United Methodist Church**. Combining our Lower School voices with those of Middle and Upper School enhances a feeling of community and strengthens the spirit of the season.

While preparing for the concert, students develop multiple aspects of their musicianship, including in-tune singing, vocal technique, musical literacy, critical-thinking skills, and listening skills. Accurate singing leads to confident, enjoyable music-making experiences.

Students increase their understanding of musical sounds through aural, visual, and physical responses. We play many different listening games that involve these types of responses. For example, older students develop and strengthen their understanding of melody by playing "Which Shape?" This is a game that asks students to listen to a melody (a series of higher and lower pitches), while picturing that melody's highs and lows as a corresponding line that creates a contour or shape. As they listen to the teacher play a melody on the piano, students answer the question "which shape?" by choosing from a set of lines on the board. As students develop their own listening and vocal skills, making music with others becomes even more rewarding.

Please join us in celebrating both the miracle of Christmas and the hard work our Lower School children have put into preparing for tomorrow's performance!

MS Schedule Changes Start January 4

ATHLETICS

In the winter season, we have four sports: swimming, soccer, wrestling, and basketball.

- For **swimming**, students practice off-campus at the Dad's Club Aquatic Center. We have nine students swimming this year, have already been in several meets, and a school record has already been broken!
- St. Francis was excited to add **soccer** this year for both the boys and the girls. Our students have been practicing hard after school and will have their first games in the new year.
- We have one student who will be **wrestling** for the school this year.
- **Basketball** has been thriving this year. Our girls' basketball team had its first win last week against St. John's, and our boys' program has added a varsity team.
