### All School

#### **Welcoming You Back in 2022**

Happy New Year! We hope that your family has enjoyed time together, and we look forward to welcoming students back to campus on Tuesday, January 4.

During the break, we have continued to monitor St. Francis's COVID-19 data along with local and regional COVID-19 information. We are aware that the COVID-19 surge due to Omicron is expected to continue for several weeks.

- Out of an abundance of caution, **St. Francis will now require student-athletes who test positive for COVID-19 to obtain clearance from a physician** before they can resume participation in athletics.
- Additionally, the **CDC has recently updated the recommended quarantine procedures**. People with COVID-19 should isolate for 5 days, and if they are asymptomatic or their symptoms are resolving (without fever for 24 hours), follow that with 5 days of wearing a mask when around others to minimize the risk of infecting people they encounter.

**We have a great spring semester ahead and remain committed to providing the St. Francis experience and in-person learning for our students.** As our staff and students prepare to return from the break, we wanted to remind everyone of the protocols that have been in place since the start of the 2021–22 school year.

- Teachers will be flexible in support of students who must be absent.
- St. Francis will work with families with extenuating medical circumstances. Please contact your student's division head.
- St. Francis requires all students or staff that are sick for any reason to remain at home. Parents should notify their student's campus nurse.
- St. Francis will require all students and staff with COVID-19 to remain off campus until re-entry criteria has been met.

- St. Francis will continue to share our COVID-19 dashboard weekly in [\*\*\*Wolf Watch\*\*\*](#) and on the [\*\*\*Parent Portal\*\*\*](#).
- St. Francis will maximize opportunities for students to be outdoors.
- St. Francis will continue to monitor, evaluate and, if necessary, change large group gatherings.
- St. Francis will continue with our enhanced cleaning protocols.
- St. Francis teachers will continue to emphasize frequent handwashing and hygiene practices.
- Masks and PPE will continue to be optional and available on all campuses. In light of the present Omicron surge, St. Francis encourages students, staff, and visitors to wear a mask while indoors on campus. Mask and PPE requirements are subject to change.
- For the safety of our community, St. Francis encourages all eligible community members to be fully vaccinated and boosted.
