Upper School

From the Division Head

There is nothing like the first day of school. For new students, there is the mix of anxiety and excitement; for returning students, the anticipation of seeing their friends and being in a new grade; for teachers, the joy of seeing the hallways full of students again.

Life on the Couper Campus has been anything but boring this summer. The Student Life Building, which was just a skeleton when our students were last on campus, has now taken shape. Curbs and landscaping will soon ring the building. The inside finishing has begun, and three gleaming flagpoles stand ready to be adorned.



Though our classrooms have been empty, we can't really say that it's been quiet on campus. Already our sports teams have been practicing in the mornings, rehearsals for the musical have begun, student council has had a retreat, the cheer squad has been preparing for its first pep rally, and much more. We have also been visited by some of our recent graduates, who have given a fond farewell before they leave Houston for their next adventures.

As we begin school this week, I'd like to make you aware of a few changes to how we will begin and to the layout of our campus.

ORIENTATION

In former years, orientation events were just for new students. This year, orientation serves our entire Upper School and culminates in a pep rally. All new students in grades 9–12 will attend the morning orientation, where they will receive laptops and an introduction to life at St. Francis. In the afternoon, all students will return to gather in advisories, receive schedules, play games together, and raise a ruckus in our pep rally.

ATTENDANCE AND PARKING

Remember to inform our Office Manager, [Lydia Urbanek](#), of any anticipated absences. All students arriving late need to check into our administration office before going to class. Since our offices have moved to the Richmond House, we will be in the gym every morning from 8:30 to 9:00 a.m. to accommodate tardy students. We will give more information on parking to students at orientation and in our first assembly. For the first few days, students will be asked to park in last year's student parking area, taking their first left as they enter campus (seniors park closest to the road; juniors and sophomores park along the fence line).
