I hope you had a blessed Thanksgiving full of turkey, pie, friends, and family!

Sharing new information regarding anything related to the curriculum and instruction at St. Francis is always a treat. Today, I will share some information about an innovative, developing program in our Upper School. While Upper School for your child may seem a long way away for some of you, it is good to be informed about what we offer and what sets St. Francis apart from other schools.

One of the most tumultuous times in a young person’s life is the transition from high school to college. Unfortunately, not only do students have to figure out where to attend,

but many universities ask them to declare a major on their application! Most seniors are not equipped to cope with these decisions, and parents can only help so much.

The addition to our Upper School curriculum—the Post-Secondary Success Program—is unique and will prove to be highly beneficial to students and parents. I know I would have loved for my own boys to have an experience such as this as they were navigating high school and trying to comprehend what was beyond.

We are blessed to have Tracey Addington leading the charge for this innovative program. She developed a similar program at her former school in Dallas, which proved to be highly successful and beneficial for that community. I asked her to write a summary of the new program (see below). I hope you enjoy learning more about this fantastic opportunity and how it will impact our students' lives.

A Note From Tracey Addington, Director of Post-Secondary Success

Over the past few decades, the greatest challenge to college students has shifted from academic and financial concerns to emotional health. The recent pandemic only exacerbated this growing crisis.

More than 1 million fewer students are enrolled in college now than before the pandemic began. U.S. colleges and universities saw a drop of nearly 500,000 undergraduate students in the fall of 2021, continuing a historic decline that began the previous fall (Source: [NPR](#), January 2022).

Seventy-six percent of bachelor's degree students who have considered leaving their college or university in the past six months say emotional stress was the reason. Students are about twice as likely to cite stress as they are to give the three next-most-reported reasons: the pandemic, cost of attendance, and coursework difficulty (Source: Gallup's [The State of Higher Education 2022 Report](#)).

St. Francis Episcopal School has implemented a post-secondary success curriculum to address the changing landscape of higher education and the challenges that independence and autonomy can pose for young adults. This programming begins before the senior year, but culminates in a unique third-trimester curriculum that allows our graduates to fully explore their unique interests and passions. The Post-Secondary Success Program engages students in independent thinking and problem-solving; builds students' networking and communication skills; and develops confident, self-reliant individuals who take ownership of their own learning.

Below is an outline of the program sequence.

NINTH GRADE

The ninth-grade curriculum focuses on self-advocacy. Students consider what it means

to self-advocate, why it is essential, and how to navigate hypothetical and real-life scenarios they may encounter in Upper School.

TENTH GRADE

While there is no post-secondary success curriculum for the sophomore class in this initial year of the program, beginning next year, sophomores will meet in the spring to explore their strengths and interests as they build self-awareness. The Myers-Briggs and CliftonStrengths assessment tools will be utilized, and results will be reviewed in individual conferences.

ELEVENTH GRADE

- During Immersions and Explorations—a week allowing the students to go outside the walls of St. Francis and into the community to explore interests—the class spent a morning working on **post-secondary planning**, including completing two career-interest inventories and two college-major-exploration assessments.
- Using the results of the Immersions and Explorations session, **all juniors will meet with me** in November and December to consider their initial post-secondary interests and planning. This information will be shared with Mr. Scales, director of college counseling, to assist him in preparing for their junior college conferences.

TWELFTH GRADE

- Since the program was new this year, our seniors also spent a morning during Immersions and Explorations working on **post-secondary planning**. During this time, they completed two career-interest inventories and two college-major-exploration assessments. They also spent time reflecting on and discussing future goals, plans, and what “success” means to them.
- All students take a **one-trimester online class** designed to assist with the transition to life after high school. The curriculum includes budgeting and finances, college academics, and physical and emotional well-being.
- All students prepare for their own **senior experience** in May, which may include an internship, a service-learning opportunity, or a creative project of their choosing.
- Students will hear from **four speakers in April** designed to assist with the post-secondary transition. They are very excited about the alumni panel event, when members of our inaugural graduating class will return to speak about their freshman years.

1. Open an Internet browser on your computer, laptop, or phone. Type in the St. Francis website—sfch.org.

2. Click on the “Watch Live Stream Worship Services” button. Either the 9:00 a.m. or 11:00 a.m. service will be available. If you prefer to watch from Facebook or YouTube, click on the links to go to those streaming servers.

Prelude music will begin on the livestream 10 minutes before the service to allow time for your connection and your inspiration. If you miss the live video, a recording of the service will also be available on [**St. Francis's YouTube channel**](#).
