Middle School

From the Division Head

Where are we going in the Middle School?

I truly believe that students ought to, as often as possible, engage in activities that closely resemble the work of experts in the field they are studying.

In sports, that looks like Middle School basketball players competing in basketball games, scrimmages, and drills. NBA players do not spend a bunch of time taking multiple choice tests about the optimal foot position and ball rotation for free-throw shooting. Instead, they practice shooting free throws.

Taylor Swift doesn't prepare for a concert by taking Cornell Notes about rhythm, cadence, volume, and pitch.

Scientists conduct research, formulate hypotheses, design and run experiments, analyze the data, and reach conclusions. That's why our science students extract DNA from strawberries, melt Starbursts, and build sound cannons.

Professional writers read. They read a lot. They also write, obviously. You know where this is going. The book clubs in our English classes give students the opportunity to read and discuss books of their choice and to identify the rhetorical moves of both professional writers and their peers.

I walked into a Spanish class recently where students had built websites to market their Shark Tank business ideas. In another Spanish class, students had written their own dialogues. Immediately after performing their scripts, they received feedback in Spanish

on their pronunciation, grammar, and syntax. They were doing what native speakers do: they spoke the language in order to communicate a message to an audience.

If you want to know why students write and read so much in their history classes, then now you know why. Historians don't just lecture about important dead people and the dates that mattered to them. I love that our history students are building medieval castles in seventh grade and trying to identify the authorial intent and cultural context of firsthand accounts from the Civil War.

What if my child doesn't have plans to be a history professor, UN interpreter, or freelance writer?

Our mission as a school states: *In the Anglican tradition, St. Francis Episcopal School challenges and motivates students in an academically and spiritually stimulating environment to become imaginative, critical thinkers for others.*

Even if your child chooses a career path that neither you nor we could imagine, our goal is to challenge and motivate them to be imaginative, critical thinkers for others.

That's where we are going, and I am encouraged by our progress toward that goal every single day!
