## Lower School

### **From the Division Head**

STEAM class is an important part of our Lower School academic experience and focuses on developing scientific understanding and knowledge by integrating science, technology, engineering, art, and math. Sometimes it gets messy, which is OK because it makes learning in STEAM meaningful and memorable.

Children in kindergarten, first grade, and second grade attend STEAM class twice a week, while students in third and fourth grades attend STEAM class every day.

Please read below to hear from our STEAM teachers about student activities that promote teamwork, organization, public speaking, and more. They have also included suggestions on ways that you can support and continue STEAM-focused learning at home.

### **A Note From the Lower School STEAM Teachers**

**Kindergartners** have been learning about different types of weather and the instruments used to measure weather. After reading about types of weather, watching brief informational videos on weather, and participating in class discussions, they made a hanging wind sock to measure wind direction and speed.

In **first grade**, we have been learning about Earth and space cycles and patterns. Students have learned about the day and night cycle, sunrise and sunset pattern, moon cycle, and seasonal cycles. They are currently making a water cycle in a bag.

**Second graders** have been using creativity and collaboration to design structures that will survive an earthquake. They have also learned about volcanic eruptions, observing how volcanic eruptions make new land.

**Third-grade students** are excited about participating in a STEAM challenge involving constructing a protective container to keep an egg from breaking when it is dropped. This project allows students to be innovative and creative in their egg-container design. They will brainstorm a list of useful materials and discuss how they might protect the egg from breaking. Students will predict, hypothesize, create, improve, and reflect on their design during this STEAM challenge.

While studying biology this spring, **fourth-grade students** will use what they have learned in class to participate in a STEAM challenge, where they create a new species of plant that would not exist in the real world. They will present it to the class, explaining what biome it lives in, how the plant reproduces, how it gets energy, and how it protects itself from enemies and weather conditions. They will also research an ocean animal of their choice, focusing on its characteristics and habitat. Each student will present the information via a Google Slides slideshow, practicing some of their technology skills.

As you can tell, STEAM is a large part of the Lower School experience. Below are a couple of resources to help you continue STEAM-focused learning at home with your child:

### **From the Division Head**

If you're a fifth- or seventh-grade family, then you know how much time our Middle Schoolers have spent showing off their performance poetry chops. I've heard some beautiful poems and had the unenviable distinction of being booed by fifth-grade students for giving scores to their classmates that fell below their expectations.

Houston Poet Laureate Outspoken Bean performed at our Black History Month program on Tuesday in the FAC. He's a local spoken word artist who captured our attention and imaginations for 30 minutes of poetic pleasure. I am no poet laureate, but all this poetic energy has inspired me to share a poem with you:

*Right Words*

The darkness caught him by surprise.  
I knew it  
When I looked into CJ'S  
Two-year old eyes  
Opened so wide  
It was impossible to hide

The tears.

He crouched next to me on the couch,  
While thunder marched  
Across the hardwood floor  
And banged on the window behind my head.  
A dim light in the corner  
Bounced enough light off the ceiling and walls  
To help us see shadows and swaying silhouettes.

As the lightning lit up the night sky  
And thunder shook the books on the shelf,  
CJ squeezed my arm  
And I watched his little levees break.

"It's dark, Uncle Byron.  
It's dark outside."

"I know, CJ; I know."

He panicked.  
He cried.  
I listened.  
I tried—to whisper a prayer  
For right words.

"The sun is gone Uncle Byron."

What could I say?  
He was right.  
He was scared.  
He was uncomforted by my prayers.

I couldn't stop the storm  
From setting off car alarms,  
Breaking branches, or shaking walls.  
I couldn't wipe his face fast enough.

Tears continued to fall.

That's sort of a sad way to end a poem. I have been accused of trying to find an uplifting ending to everything I write, so I tried something different this time.

However, as I re-read the helplessness I felt as a babysitter that night, my mind can't help but go to our brothers and sisters in Turkey and Syria who are at this very moment suffering from real, not perceived, pain and loss. The magnitude of their crisis is hard to fathom. The death toll is near 50,000 at this point. Over 164,000 buildings have been destroyed. Their tears continue to fall. Their buildings continue to fall. Hundreds of thousands of children, women, and men are freezing in the bitter cold while their homes, their neighborhoods, and their cities lie in ruin.

What do you do when you look at devastation of that magnitude?

Something. You do something.

Many of you have already been moved to help. There are many ways that we can help. We are, as a part of our school's identity, people for others.

### From the Division Head

We are glad for student-led conferences to come around again this week. If you haven't already, please check your email for an invitation to sign up for a time on Wednesday.

The second conference of the year is much different from the first. Students still lead the presentation to the advisor and parents, but the main difference is that so much has happened between our two meetings. At the first conference, there weren't very many grades and we were all bright-eyed and bushy-tailed about the year. Since then, there

have been successes and failures. For the former, we congratulate talent, intellectual growth, and maturity—but how do we regard failure?

Our culture says that failure is to be shrunk from and castigated. Clearly, the child has failed and it is time for the adults to move in! But I want to suggest another path. We should embrace failure and learn how to leverage our strengths to bounce back.

This past week in AP Psychology, the students were visited by [Dr. Becca North](#), a professor at the Huston-Tillotson University and daughter of our own Interim Head of School, Don North. In preparation for her presentation and Q&A, students read a chapter from her recent publication, [Your Hidden Superpowers](#). In Dr. North's session, she discussed how society stigmatizes failure, and that this is such a loss when research and experience have affirmed the value of failure on the pathway to success. In fact, many famous politicians, writers, and thinkers have achieved greatness only after coming to terms with the role of failure in their lives. Key to their success was learning how to view setbacks as opportunities for growth and learning.



In our conferences this week, I wonder how we can help this young generation to embrace and not fear failure. And maybe the best place to start is for us to show them we aren't afraid of failure ourselves.
