From the Head of Curriculum and Instruction

I hope this week was filled with family time, fun, and relaxation. These last few months will fly by!

This week, I wanted to highlight an essential part of our school that you may only visit from time to time—our libraries.

We have two “not-so-new” faces in the Crum Library—Director of Library Services Ali Salinas and Assistant Director of Library Services Dana Kenningham. This is Mrs. Salinas’s seventh year at St. Francis as both a faculty member and a parent. Her extensive background in literacy, curriculum development, and instruction has proved invaluable as she works with students and teachers, making the library a central hub for teaching and learning. Mrs. Kenningham also has years of teaching experience and has served St. Francis for years as a long-term and daily substitute in many Lower School classrooms. She knows our curriculum, programming, and students well!

Mrs. Salinas and Mrs. Kenningham have initiated many fun, engaging events for the school. In November, they organized a drive for gently used books benefiting Books Between Kids. Mrs. Salinas’s **Middle School Library Leaders Club gathered and sorted over 1,100 books for this donation.** These books will benefit at-risk students in pre-K through grade 5 by providing them with books to build their own home libraries.



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An activity hosted in the Crum Library that our younger friends look forward to is **reading with our Middle School National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) members on Thursday mornings before school**. Mrs. Salinas conducted a small workshop for the NJHS students, teaching them how to be engaging and effective readers for their younger friends.





In addition to organizing these events, **Mrs. Salinas and Mrs. Kenningham are working tirelessly to increase the book selection across every genre in our library** and to organize the books in an optimally student-friendly manner. Purchasing classics, new books, series of books, and special collections that students enjoy is an ongoing goal for our librarians. Students and teachers may also request that they purchase books on a particular interest or topic. They are becoming very good shoppers! Literally hundreds of books have been added to our collection, which is being organized by genre to make book shopping simpler for teachers and students alike. Using designated databases, St. Francis's librarians also work hand-in-hand with our classroom teachers, supporting student research in their content classes.

Our librarians are also working hard on our **Spring Book Fair**, which is coming up on April 27 and 28. Our theme for this year is "Soar Into Summer!" Stay tuned for more information, coming soon in *Wolf Watch!*

- Shorts and skirts are not permitted in the temple. (Your child will be given a sarong to wear if his or her knees are showing.)
- Students will be required to remove shoes during their visit.

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A Note About National Honor Society Invitations

This week, we invited qualifying students to apply for membership in the National Honor Society. Qualified students have at least sophomore status; have spent two or more trimesters at St. Francis; and have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or above for all coursework completed in their most recent trimester at St. Francis.

- All eligible students were invited to attend an informational meeting on March 10 and were given full information about the selection process.
- Students are held responsible for monitoring their email and following through with the application process themselves.
- Following spring break, students who are interested in applying for membership will turn in their applications, which will be reviewed by the Faculty Council. Our Faculty Council will examine each application to determine whether the student meets the standards of the National Honor Society: community service, leadership, and character. We will then communicate to our students and their families whether they have been accepted into our chapter.
- All inductees will be officially recognized at a ceremony in April.
