### From the Primary School Motor Teacher

My main objective as the Primary School Motor Teacher is to teach students about the importance of physical movement and how it helps develop muscles they need in everyday life. There are many benefits to having Motor class in the Primary School. It promotes long-lasting health, boosts confidence and self-esteem, provides an avenue for energy release, and promotes brain development.

During Motor, students learn a warm-up routine of exercises and stretches. They also begin building their cardio after warm-ups. Students are encouraged to participate to help increase confidence and keep their bodies moving. They then play a variety of games and participate in activities that help strengthen their fine and gross motor skills, as well as their hand-eye

coordination. The students love the games and do not even realize that they are strengthening their motor skills through play.

To help encourage students who are hesitant to join the activities or are non-active, I like to play along and model the activity. The students love when I am involved in the games, and this gives them another reason to get up and play. In the Reggio-inspired approach, teachers are guides who learn alongside the children. Motor offers another opportunity for a partnership between the students and the teacher.

I really enjoy working with all the grade levels in the Primary School and am grateful for the opportunity to work in the Primary School with amazing children, faculty, and staff.

# **Middle School**

#### From the Division Head

The students on our record-breaking Middle School Track team will tell you that you don't run TO the finish line, you run THROUGH the finish line. I'm no track coach, but my high school track coach told the sprinters that if we ran to the line, then our bodies would start to slow down before we reached the end and someone who was close could pass us up in the final meters of the race.

Middle schoolers, don't let up. I know that summer is right around the corner, but it's not here yet. What does it look like to finish strong?

- 1. Make a plan. You still have homework, projects, quizzes, tests, and games. Put them in your planner. Identify specific times when you will prepare for those assessments, participate in those activities, and submit those assignments. If you're struggling in math, pick one day a week or more when you will visit your math teacher for tutorials or study hall. Write down when you are going to create your Quizlet for your Spanish test. What will it take to be ready? Do that and a little more. Spread the preparation out over multiple days.
- 2. **Show up.** Get to school on time. Get to class on time. Come prepared. Restock your pencil bag with pens, pencils, erasers, highlighters, earbuds (for watching teacherassigned videos), and whatever else you use in class often. Whenever you leave class to go get school supplies, you miss instruction or practice. Show up ready to learn.
- 3. **Respect yourself, other people, and our property.** After nine months in the same advisory, the same first-period class, the same lunchroom, the same locker, and the same hallways, it's easy to get frustrated with your teachers and your peers. Their jokes have turned from funny to annoying. Their personalities have changed from charming to grating. Give them grace. Respect them.
- 4. **Stay curious.** There's more to learn. There's more to experience. Rather than checking out or complaining, consider the possibility that you might be able to learn more. Keep asking great questions and listening for the answers.

This is not the time for quitting or easing up. Finishing strong is a habit and a skill. Resist the urge to ease up in April and May. Finish strong, Wolves!

We are happy to introduce St. Francis's first for-credit academic class this summer—World Religions, available to current sophomores (rising juniors). There are a few reasons why summer classes are beneficial:

• **Demonstration of Academic Interest**—The summer is a long time. Sure, we have vacations and the like, but there is plenty of room to take a trimester-length course.

- Moreover, taking classes in the summer will demonstrate to colleges that these students are engaged.
- Freedom in the Schedule During the Year—Required trimester classes, while enriching and an important part of our curriculum, can burden a student's schedule. Knocking the course out in the summer allows students to pursue their interests: extra AP classes, participating in both productions, programming classes, etc.
- **But What About Our Summer Schedule?!** This summer class will be offered in a "blended online" format, whereby the majority of the content, homework, and assessments will be online. Seven classes will be offered sporadically throughout June and the beginning of July. While attendance at every class is encouraged, students are required to attend only four classes. To offer further convenience, students can attend class virtually. All class lectures will also be recorded and saved for later review.
