Primary School

From the Division Head

The Primary School offered three days after school for families to garden with their children. Thirteen garden beds were weeded, cleaned, and filled with soil. Our eager gardeners planted a variety of vegetable, fruit, and flower seeds.

The timing was perfect, as the gardening was completed right before Earth Day. The gardens are now rich with greenery and healthy growth. (You can view pictures of the community garden, including from our gardening days, by clicking here, here)

Primary School's community garden is a favorite area for students to observe budding tomatoes, leeks, and fig trees. Students enjoy chatting about the discovery of small fruit and their curiosity of what may sprout next. Most recently, mint from one of the gardens was added to spa water that was enjoyed by Mothers and Others guests in Mrs. Hughes's and Mr. Rousett's class.

A visit from Urban Harvest, organized by our Reggio parent group, served as motivation to start a community garden. In addition, we have begun conversations about farm-to-table experiences with our Primary School children.

Moreover, gardening affords students authentic and meaningful learning opportunities. It also helps them develop life skills, including responsibility when caring for the plants; understanding the life cycle as plants grow and die; self-confidence when observing the growth of what they have planted; sensory stimulation as they feel different textures of plants, experience the different smells and tastes of plants, and see plant variations; and improved fine- and gross-motor skills as they work in gardens.

^{*}All sixth-, seventh-, and eighth-grade students will also need a TI-30XS calculator.

Positive emotions are often expressed when children engage with gardens. Stress levels are decreased, and students feel a sense of joy.

We are excited about our Primary School gardens and proud of the community effort that was implemented to nurture them. Like the gardens, our children are experiencing wondrous and amazing growth. It is always a pleasure to learn alongside them and to join you on their early childhood journey.

Middle School

From the Division Head

I received two questions from an eighth grader this week:

- 1. Should we be scared about our final exams?
- 2. When should we start studying for exams?

During our final week of school in May, sixth graders will take unit exams, seventh graders will take end-of-trimester exams, and eighth graders will take cumulative final exams.

If you are in eighth grade and you haven't started thinking about exams, then you should probably get to work ASAP, especially since you only have two weeks to prepare after you return from Boston.

What are some concrete steps you can take to start preparing for your end-of-year assessments?

- 1. Put all of your quizzes, tests, other important assessments, and study guides into a folder or binder (digital or hard copies). Organize them by class in the order in which you took them. Some classes already require you to do this throughout the year.
- 2. Identify all of the major topics that will be covered on the exam. You can create this list in a Google Doc or on a sheet of paper that you keep in your final-exams binder. Create one list of topics/skills for each class.
- 3. Create your own study guide that has a question for everything you will need to know in order to prepare for the exam. According to Daniel Willingham, author of *Outsmart Your Brain*, your study guide should be so thorough that you can study it and nothing else.
- 4. Check in with your teachers. Talk to them about the resources you've gathered and the questions you've created to study, and ask for their feedback.

In our Final Exams Bootcamp this week, we've talked about the importance of Effortful Retrieval and the importance of spacing out our practice over time. Students discussed several examples that demonstrated how spaced practice makes learning deeper and more durable.

If you're only going to spend three hours preparing for that science test, then start today by spending 20 to 30 minutes creating a tree diagram of your notes on the Rock Cycle, mitosis v. meiosis, or the Laws of Motion. Then, tomorrow, try to recreate that diagram without using your notes. Check it against your textbook and notes. The next day, you can recreate the diagram from memory, and then write open-ended questions about each major branch of the diagram.

One of the best ways to come up with productive study activities is to observe the types of activities that your teacher has you do in class. If the teacher often asks you to write paragraphs to analyze a narrative passage, then create and respond to similar writing prompts.

The biggest piece of advice I have three weeks before final exams is this: Start studying today. Remember that organizing your study materials and creating a study schedule are a part of the studying process.

Important AP Exam Information

AP Exams will begin tomorrow—Monday, May 1. The following information was sent to families last week. Please be sure to review this important information:

- **PUNCTUALITY:** Students should arrive to their assigned location 10 minutes before the scheduled start time. (E.g., if an exam starts at 8:00 a.m., be there by 7:50 a.m.) Please note that you will need to be here earlier than normal for the morning exams. Although St. Francis classes start later, the morning AP exams begin at 8:00 a.m. as dictated by College Board. Do not be late.
 - NOTE: On Wednesday, May 3, AP English Literature students must arrive on time despite it being a Late-Start Day for St. Francis.
- WHAT TO BRING: Students should bring several sharpened No. 2 pencils (not mechanical); a pen (blue or black ink only); and an approved calculator to use with exams that permit one.
- **FOOD:** Students should eat a healthy breakfast in the morning. Those with afternoon exams will be dismissed from class a bit early to eat lunch. No food or drink will be allowed in the room. If you're in extended time for a morning exam, we will provide boxed lunches from Sage, or you can bring your own food.
- **REQUIRED:** Yes, you have to take the AP exam if you are enrolled in the course.
- **ATTIRE:** You will need to wear standard school uniforms on exam days. These are not free dress days. No hats/beanies, jeans, yoga pants, etc. For exams that take place on Friday Spirit dress days, you can wear an approved St. Francis T-shirt with uniform bottoms.
- **OTHER CLASSES:** For juniors who have morning AP exams, you will return to your afternoon classes as normal after lunch.
- LOCATIONS: The rooms below are for all exams. If you have approved
 accommodations from College Board (like extended time), I have already sent a
 separate email notifying you. Extended-time locations are indicated with "XT"
 in the chart below.
